OCA CIRCULAR NO. <u>210-2023</u>

TO: ALL JUDGES OF THE FIRST AND SECOND LEVEL COURTS

SUBJECT: ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF FOREIGN APOSTILLES

All Judges of the First and Second Level Courts are hereby **REMINDED** of the Philippines' obligation to acknowledge foreign Apostilles under the Apostille Convention¹, either electronically issued or printed,² subject to the prevailing jurisprudence and/or applicable Court issuances related thereto.

¹ The Philippines became a party to the Apostille Convention on May 14, 2019.

² Article 3 (1) Apostille Convention or Convention of 5 October 1961 Abolishing the Requirement of Legalisation for Foreign Public Documents.

^{**}Exempted to this rule are the documents coming from Austria, Finland, Germany, and Greece, considering that these countries, although Member Parties to the Apostille Convention, have objected to the Philippines' accession. For these documents, the process of legalization is still a requirement. Another exemption to this rule is when the received Apostille and/or attachments are doubtful or have serious defects.
